Message from AIM's Leadership

Over the past year, Anderson has seen the community come together, just as it always does in a crisis. After the devastation of Hurricane Helene, the community responded by answering our plea to restock our shelves after we experienced record numbers of individuals needing food, water, and more.

Our Housing Rehabilitation program has gained new contractors, volunteers, and donors to help make much needed repairs to homes in Anderson County. The storm only multiplied this need. Without this community providing gap funding to leverage other program dollars, this work would not be possible.

Our Employment Pathways Program provided crucial training for SNAP Recipients in response to the loss of federal dollars and lack of skilled workers in the medical field.

Our community came together, once again, to provide a new space for AIM's FoodShare Program to grow. Anderson School District 5 gave AIM the opportunity to make use of a building off Fant St. to have proper space to house this new program. The program provides affordable and healthy produce options for a reduced rate to not only SNAP recipients, but all Anderson residents. This would not have been possible without our community's support, which started with a challenge grant issued by Carol and William Kenley and met by many community members, AnMed, First Presbyterian Church, Anderson University Athletics & more.

We are grateful for this community that responds to the needs of its people and we pray that this support will continue long after the reminders of the storm. Thank you, Anderson, for supporting AIM over the past 35 years and we ask for your continued support as we continue to "Give Hope and Change Lives" in this community. -AIM Leadership

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)

AIM's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program is a powerful anti-poverty tool, providing free tax preparation services ensuring that hard-working individuals receive the maximum benefits available without losing hundreds of dollars in paid-preparer fees. AIM's VITA Program hosts tax assistance locations at community and neighborhood centers, churches, and other convenient locations across Anderson County.

Pivotal Support Program

Pivotal Support assists individuals with an immediate need and connects them with the tools that can stabilize their future. If approved, the assistance plan may include limited financial support with the long-term goal of self-sufficiency. Individuals are encouraged to attend monthly financial classes and workshops.

Housing Rehabilitation



Community homeowners who are low-income earners may be eligible for assistance with needed household maintenance or adjustments. Eligible services include ramps and other necessary repairs that threaten the health and safety of these families and their ability to remain living in their home.



Coalition for Home Repair received a Veterans Housing and Modification Pilot Program (VHRMP) grant award in support of the Operation Safe Homes Initiative. The organization is using the award to modify and rehabilitate the homes of low-income and disabled veterans nationwide by working with its member organizations, like AIM! Throughout 12 subrecipients of the grant in 6 states, **FIVE** VHRMP Projects have been completed.

FOUR of those were through AIM for Anderson Veterans.
